(1) The genesis of this research/learning project - Mike Nolan & Patrick Nisbet

 Mike Nolan – Online Religious Education Assessment ... why might we undertake such a learning project:

The purpose, as I would see it, regarding this possible project, is to ...

- provide our teachers, participating schools (and the Diocese) with well-informed feedback on their students knowledge and understanding of the (say) Years 1, 2 & 3 (to be confirmed) NZ RE curriculum with the assessment taking place in Term 1 when the students are in Year 4;
- o in order that the teachers and schools;
- o and the Diocese in terms of professional development offerings; perhaps the development of a new TCI papers to support teachers in teaching the RE curriculum
- o might reflect on and respond to individual and collective teaching practices in order to increase RE learning outcomes for their students ...
 - o is a concept not understood because of a lack of teacher knowledge?
 - o an unhelpful pedagogical approach?
 - o a lack of targeted teaching strategies?; etc ...
 - i.e. an interrogation of the data/results leading to teacher inquiry questions to focus on improving student learning outcomes.

Whilst our focus would be mainly on the cognitive domain (knowledge of the RE curriculum), perhaps we could also explore some questions on the affective domain and general religious literacy?
