


Praying Together as a Board of Trustees

What is Christian Prayer?

For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy.
(St Thérèse of Lisieux)



Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God. (St John Damascene)

Prayer is a vital and personal and true relationship with the living and true God.
(Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2558)

True prayer is nothing but love. (St Augustine)

Prayer is the inner bath of love into which the soul plunges itself. (St John Vianney)

Everyone of us needs half an hour of prayer each day, except when we are busy – then we need an hour.
(St Francis de Sales)

Prayer is Christian insofar as it is communion with Christ and extends throughout the Church, which is his Body. Its dimensions are those of Christ's love.
(Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2565)

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The Focus of Christian Prayer

Christian prayer is always Trinitarian. It leads us towards the Father, to whom we gain access through Jesus Christ. It is the Holy Spirit who helps draw us near to Jesus.



The Church loves to pray in communion with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. We join Mary in praising God for his great gifts to her and we seek her prayerful intercession on our own behalf and on behalf of others. Likewise, we honour and seek the intercession of the saints –

models of Christian prayer.

Aspects of Christian Prayer

Adoration

Adoration flows from an attitude that acknowledges we are creatures in the presence of our Creator. It is an act by which we glorify the God who made us. We adore God from whom all blessings flow.


Petition

Petition takes many forms – to ask, to implore, to plead, to cry out. Prayer of petition acknowledges how much we depend on God for our need, including forgiveness and persistence in seeking Him. When we practice the prayer of petition we remember Christ's instruction to ask in order to receive, to seek in order to find, and to knock in order that the door may be opened (see Matthew 7:7).

The first movement of the prayer of petition is asking forgiveness for our sins. Humility and repentance return us to communion with Christ.

Intercession

Intercession is the prayer that we make on behalf of the needs of others. Jesus Christ is always interceding for us. God calls us also to intercede for one another – even for our enemies.



Thanksgiving

Every moment or event can become an opportunity for thanksgiving. We are called to thank God for all the gifts we have received, including our joys and sorrows, all of which, through love, can work for our benefit. The Mass, the celebration of the Eucharist, is the Church’s greatest prayer of thanksgiving.

Praise

“Praise is the form of prayer which recognises most immediately that God is God It shares in the blessed happiness of the pure of heart who love God in faith before seeing him in glory” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2639). Scripture is full of outpourings of praise for God. When we praise God with simplicity and an open heart, we obtain a glimpse of the joy of the angels and saints in heaven.

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Prayer and Special Character

Prayer Opens

*Were not our hearts burning while he spoke to us and
opened the Scriptures to us (Luke 24:32)*

When We Pray God Opens Us . . .

- to the depths of His love for us revealed in Christ
- to Jesus' life-giving vision for ourselves and our world
- to a deeper understanding of ourselves, our life journey and our life choices
- to honesty and personal vulnerability
- to examine our attitudes, values, habits feelings, decisions and lifestyle
- to trust and discern God's call and purpose in our lives

An Opening Prayer

God of Wisdom

Open us through the Holy Spirit
to embrace your Living Word
allowing its riches to permeate our being

Open our ears to hear your Gospel proclaimed
Open our minds to understand how you speak into our lives

Open our hearts to recognise you in the goodness of others

Open our eyes to see you in the beauty of our world

Open our hands to offer you praise and worship

Open our emotions to the joy of your presence

Open our lives to the breath of your Holy Spirit.

Prayer Transforms

*Do not be conformed to this world, but be **transformed** by the renewal of your mind (Romans 12:2)*

When We Pray God Transforms Us . . .

- through intimacy of relationship with the One who loves us in the depths of our being and human character
- through growth into who we are meant to be according to God's vision and purpose
- through reflection on our behaviour and actions
- through our acceptance of God's gifts
- through the ordinary circumstances of our lives

A Transforming Prayer

God of Change

Transform us into the image of Jesus
through the power of the Holy Spirit
at work in us

Transform our anger and resentment into love
Transform our indifference into compassion
Transform our hearts of stone into hearts of flesh
Transform our shallowness into integrity
Transform our inaction into the pursuit of justice
Transform our pettiness into generosity
Transform our selfishness into service
Transform our timidity into courage.
